



How to Request Accommodations

Disability is defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act as a "physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of such individual; a record of such an impairment; or being regarded as having such an impairment." Major life activities include, but are not limited to "functions such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, working.

Students requesting accommodations should

1. complete an accommodation request form online. (Hard copy format is available upon request)

ACCOMMODATION REQUEST FORM

- Available on our website
 - A link to the form is on the ASO webpage
 - Hard copies are available upon request
- Why should you fill out this form?
 - It is the student's responsibility to identify themselves to ASO
 - Accommodations do not automatically carry over from one semester to the next
 - ASO Coordinator does not know that you are enrolled or need accommodations, unless you fill out the
 accommodation intake/request form every semester
- When should you fill out this form?
 - At the beginning of every semester to request accommodations for that semester

DOCUMENTATION

- Generally accepted types of documentation
 - Recent IEP, 504, copies from ARD meetings, etc.
 - Evaluation by Vocational Rehabilitation Services or diagnostic testing
 - Recent letter from your healthcare provider on their letterhead or diagnostic testing
- Recent means 5 years or less. However, older documentation will be considered.
 - Recent documentation is a better reflection of your current needs
- Should include
 - Your name, date of birth, and date of report
 - Diagnosis and how it affects your academic experience
 - Specific recommendations for accommodations
 - Examples of specific recommendations such as extended time on test, quiet environment, text-to-speech or other unambiguous recommendations that clarify what is helpful for you
 - Documentation requesting special accommodations is not helpful in determining accommodations

Approval of Accommodations

- Coordinator notifies your professors
 - Coordinator will add your name, ID, and accommodations to your professors' accommodation spreadsheet
- Coordinator notifies you by email
 - Coordinator emails you a confirmation listing your approved accommodations
- It is your responsibility to follow-up for clarification or questions as soon as possible

WORKFORCE RECRUITMENT PROGRAM (WRP)

Grayson College participates in the Workforce Recruitment Program. Individual student participation is optional.

- Students and recent grads apply in the fall for the next year's program. Student must:
 - Be a person with a disability and eligible for hiring under the Schedule A Hiring Authority for persons with disabilities.
 - Be a U.S. citizen.
 - Be a current, full-time, degree-seeking, post-secondary student OR have graduated from such an institution within two and a half years of the December release of the database.
- Students may also participate if they meet all of the other requirements for the program but are taking a reduced course load due to a disability or if they are taking less than a full-time load in the term/enrollment period immediately prior to graduation because they do not need a full course load to graduate.
